

# Nicholas finishes season with 69-44 win over Devils

The Nicholas County Bluejackets finished their regular season with triumph as they defeated the

Denning Devils by a score of 69-44. The Jackets retained the dominant team throughout the game and were able to hold a lead, however slight it might have been.

The five senior players, Barry Bretz, Barry Frost, Donald Markland, Paul Quinn and Mike Sewell were put in as starters to lead the team. The seniors indeed did lead the team and well, gaining a margin that would take the team to a victory.

Quinn gained possession of the ball following tip-off. Fifty-four seconds had ticked away when a Jacket play was called in a foul. After field goal attempts made by both teams, Mike Sewell was fouled. Sewell was two for two at the foul line, scoring the first two points of the game. Denning was held scoreless until 3:48 showed on the clock. Upon receiving the ball, Bretz made a field goal attempt. Quinn rebounding, scoring and raising the score to 4-2. The Devils received the ball only to

turn it over, but were able to regain possession on a rebound. The Devils tied the score and even surpassed the Jackets by a score of 44-48 as the Jackets were called for another foul. By the quarter's end the Jackets had a margin of two, 44-46.

As in the first quarter, the Devils gained possession of the ball, and the line were able to score the first two points of the quarter, tying the score. Bretz was able to score two with the assistance of Frost. Sewell, with agile hands, was able to steal the ball and assist David McCutley to score another two, raising the score to 14-10. Denning returned to its half-court and 30-50. Denning broke the monotony with a foul. Sewell made two with freshman Steve Anderson's assistance. McCutley was able to steal the ball before time was called for an injured Denning player.

As both teams returned to the court the Jackets weren't to give up. The leading Markland scored four points in a row (one basket following a Denning turnover) with assistance of Sewell on one. Bretz on another. Denning was one for two at the foul line. After he was fouled, McCutley added two points to the score, with Bretz assisting. The

Devils in turn scored another two. The half ended with the Devils trailing 29-39.

Frost led the team in rebounds for the half with four. Sewell lead in scoring with eight points and had three steals. Third quarter began with Denning, once again, receiving the ball after tip-off. Sewell stole the ball and assisted McCutley to score the first two. The Devils scored and the Jackets raced down the court to add another two to their score. The Devils scored again and Markland scored for the Jackets, after rebounding it first. As soon as Denning received the ball Markland stole it and made a field goal attempt. McCutley rebounded to their basket, pointing the clock time-out to try to reorganize and get their game plan back into shape. The Jackets outplayed the Devils for the rest of the quarter letting it close at 36-43.

During the entire fourth quarter the Devils played with unending energy. McCutley scored the first two points of the quarter. With 6:06 standing on the clock a Denning player was two for two at the foul line. The quarter continued and ended with the Jackets dominating in all.

McCutley led the team in scoring with 19 points, with Markland following closely with 18 points. The leading Jackets played were McCutley with 15 and Frost with six. Sewell stole the ball a total of five times during the game.
