### Human Resources budget cuts; meeting planned

Through a series of informal public meetings, the Department for Human Resources hopes to find out how Kentuckians view the current government budget crisis and its effects on various social, health and public assistance programs.

The department has scheduled 10 meetings during March and April at sites throughout the state. Dr. Grady Stumbo, secretary of the department, said he hopes people will come and voice their concerns.

The public meeting for this area is planned at Lexington Technical Institute Auditorium, Cooper Drive, on Tuesday, March 24 at 7 p.m. (ET). "Reductions in our programs and services are inevitable," said Stumbo. "We know a lot of these reductions are going to be unpopular and in some cases difficult to cope with. We are genuinely concerned about the impact these cutbacks are having at the local level."

Through the meetings, he said, department representatives hope to help communities define what the budget cuts will mean locally and start looking for other ways to fill the gap in services.
