Mark Twain's brief encounter in the Civil War to be dramatized on KET

The 90-minute special "The Private History of a Campaign That Failed" airing Monday, April 6 at 8 p.m. (ET), 7 p.m. (CT) on KET is based on Mark Twain's own brief stint in the Confederate militia at the beginning of the Civil War.

"I'll get an increase of over \$4 million in TV revenue," Cawood says, "because of the switch from NBC to CBS next year. Crime in Kentucky up 11.3 percent
Crime in Kentucky took another jump again last year, according to interim figures released by State Police Commissioner Marion D. Campbell. Burglaries were up 18.1 percent, aggravated assaults up 17.5 percent, carjacks up 14.4 percent, robberies up 8.8 percent and auto thefts up 1.1 percent. Of the seven major offenses followed by state police in computing the annual crime rate, only murder, down 4.3 percent, and forcible rape, down 2.3 percent, went against the otherwise upward trend.

Although the final tabulation of Kentucky's 1980 crime and arrest figures will not be ready for release until about July 1, the preliminary data given out by Campbell shows the number of major crimes reported statewide during the past year rose approximately 11.3 percent as compared with a 6.2 percent increase in 1979.
