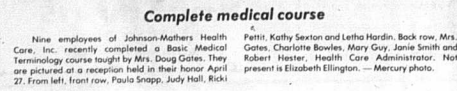




NCHS alumni banquet is May 23

Kay's Kitchen

Wash your favorite vegetable dip as an hors d'oeuvre. They are really delicious.

Seems Peanut Butter Pie is popular right now. If you have not tried it this would be a good time. The following recipe was given to me by a friend and is good. I have not made it but have eaten the results. It is rich, so not too large a serving.

PEANUT BUTTER PIE

Beat well 8 ounce package of cream cheese, 13-ounce jar crunchy peanut butter, 1 pound but powdered sugar, 2 tablespoons vanilla. Fold in 8 ounce can of prepared whipped topping. Pour into 2 baked pastry shells. Chill several hours. Freeze well.

NEW POTATOES

Scrub potatoes and peel a small hand from around the center. Slice in salted water to cover until tender, about 20 minutes. Drain and keep hot. When ready to serve put into serving dish and pour melted butter over the potatoes and sprinkle with parsley.

LEMON BROCCOLI

If at all possible use fresh broccoli. Trim florets from lower stems, then remove large stalk. Slice. Cut remaining broccoli thru stems to florets, then pull apart. Cook in boiling salted water until just tender. Drain at once. Put into serving dish and top with lemon wedges. You may want to serve a bit of mayonnaise or Hollandaise sauce. If so serve in separate dish.

FROSTING

1 large bowl of Cool Whip
2 ounces can crushed pineapple (Save juice)
1 box instant vanilla pudding
Combine dry pudding and drained pineapple. Fold in Cool Whip. Frost the three layers and sides. (This makes a tall lovely cake.) Keep cake refrigerated.
