

## Reducing Theft

### Another Ford Success Story

A recent editorial in the *Lexington Herald* called efforts to reduce thefts of gold and silver a "success story."

What happened in this *Columbiana*—Fayette is a good example—are passing ordinances requiring various steps to be taken before gold and silver can be sold and melted down. Dealers must, for instance, hold purchases for a given period of time, be licensed and obtain specific information from sellers.

This makes it more difficult for criminals to dispose of their stolen goods. In Lexington, because officials took action and an ordinance was passed, such thefts have dropped 90 percent.

Who was the leader in getting communities to act on such measures?

Sen. Ed Ford.

He brought groups together. He proposed cooperative action. He encouraged local ordinances.

Today, fewer homes are being burglarized. Police are better equipped to apprehend those who steal silver and gold. Ford took the lead, and it worked, for all of us.
