Kay's Kitchen

It's fresh strawberry time again! I know you have been having strawberries from Florida, California, or wherever, but now on the next few days homegrown strawberries will be available. So strawberry lovers enjoy this delightful fruit. Away with the recipes calling for frozen berries, lots of sugar and gelatin, and other means of stretching the flavor of the berries. You can eat them just as they are, or try something really different, keeping the fresh flavor of the berries. The following are a few of my favorites and so easy.

STRAWBERRY SYLLABUB: About 2 cups strawberries, 3 tablespoons sugar, or to taste (to taste grated orange zest), 2 cups heavy cream. Mash 1 cup of the strawberries and add sugar and orange rind. Whip the cream until stiff and add the strawberry mixture to the cream. Whip again. When ready to serve fold in 1 cup of sliced strawberries. Spoon into serving dishes garnish with additional whipped cream and a trusted strawberry.

ENGLISH SHORTBREAD: 2 cups all purpose flour, 3/4 cup powdered sugar, 1/2 cup butter, 1 1/2 sticks butter or margarine. Sift dry ingredients into bowl and work in butter with your fingers until it is like coarse cornmeal. Empty out onto a surface, baking sheet, smoothing out to about one-fourth inch thick. Smooth edges by pressing down and shaping with spatula. Smooth top by pressing down with the palm of your hand. Prick all over with fork. Bake 25 to 30 degrees even until shored bread begins to turn golden.

FROSTED STRAWBERRIES: 1 pint fresh strawberries, 1 egg white, beaten until foamy, 1/4 cup white sugar, 1/2 cup cream, or if no stem, use hotdoop, brush berries with egg white, then sprinkle with sugar. Place on rack to dry. Use as a garnish or as a confection.
