

Fleming-Mason RECC receives \$2.3 million

The state Public Service Commission has approved the financing and construction of a \$2.3 million expansion program for the Fleming-Mason Rural Electric Cooperative Corp.

The project will consist of the construction of electric distribution and service lines.

Financing will include a \$1 million loan from the Federal Rural Electrification Administration and a \$750,000 loan from the National Rural Utilities Cooperative Finance Corp.

Fleming-Mason RECC serves over 12,000 member consumers in Bath, Bracken, Fleming, Lewis, Mason, Nicholas, Robertson and Rowan counties.

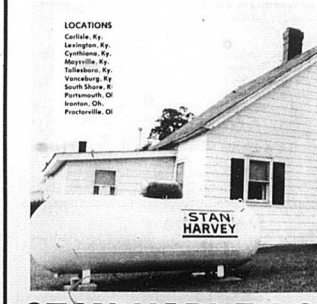
