County power to impose tax

Magistrate Mitchell felt that the Court's ruling was a taxing ordinance and imposed the 3.5 cent tax along with the ambulance taxing district with the power to collect it. Magistrate Bus Atkinson seconded the motion. Although considerable controversy surrounds the actual vote for the tax since no roll call was taken, the record shows that it passed 4-1 with one member abstaining. Magistrate Mitchell, Atkinson and Fryman voted for the tax, as did Judge Executive Bruce Smoot. Magistrate Andrew Bretz abstained, and Bob Livingston was not present when the vote was taken.

The Court then declared a state of emergency and imposed the tax without a second reading. Magistrate-elect Earl Plank was asked by the Court what he felt about the proposal. Plank replied, "I don't want to make any comment at all. I don't have any opinion. We have to have an ambulance service, but I have no comment on this." Mayor-elect Frankie Hughes was asked how much the City could be able to contribute to the ambulance service. Hughes said that he could make no commitments. The Court then formed a four-member board to oversee the taxing district. It was to be composed of three members from the Court and one from the Council. According to Magistrate Harold Mitchell, the Court then committed itself the next day to purchase an ambulance from Mothers-Gauche Funeral Home for \$8,000. They were also planning to obtain another from Paris for \$1,900. The ambulance board was also considering applicants for the coordinator's position.

Farmer leaves state Democratic post

Kentucky Democratic Party Chairman Tracy Farmer announced last week that after overseeing major Democratic victories, he will be leaving his post as head of the state party. Farmer gave the candidates and party workers their well-wishes campaign in the Nov. 3 election during a news conference at the state headquarters in Frankfort. "We have witnessed a Democratic sweep in Louisville and Jefferson County thanks to a ticket headed by two outstanding leaders, Mayor-elect Harvey Sitton and Jim 'Pop' Malone," Farmer said. "We came very close to upsetting an incumbent Republican chair who had been looked at a shoo-in. No Republican in a shoo-in when a united Democratic party charges."

"What's more, we still have a firm grip on the General Assembly and on the courthouses throughout the state," Farmer attributed the wins to the voters' belief in the party's ideas and to a backlash against President Reagan's economic policies.
