McCreary gets IRB shopping center
The State Industrial Revenue Bond Oversight Committee has approved a \$14 million bond sale to finance construction of a shopping center in McCreary County. The committee approved the bond financing by a 3-2 vote, after hearing the project's developers and opponents during a public hearing. The shopping center will contain a variety store, a grocery, a pharmacy and other retail shop space. An Atlanta firm, Richard S. Miller Associates, will develop the shopping center. The committee's approval means the county may sell the five industrial revenue bonds to finance the project. Income from the venture will be used to pay off the debt. McCreary County will issue the bonds, but neither the county nor the state is financially responsible for the bond sale.
