### Kay's Kitchen

During a conversation the other day someone asked me what the difference was between soup and stew. Never having given it a great deal of thought before, I decided I had better look in the dictionary and find out. According to Webster's New World Dictionary, a soup is a liquid food with a mixture of meat and several vegetables, cooked by slow boiling or simmering. It may be of German origin. A liquid food made by cooking meats, vegetables, fish, etc. in water or stock. In a stew, the vegetables and meats are cut into larger pieces, and a beef or chicken broth is added in small quantities. Soups are thinner and the meat and vegetables are cut into smaller pieces and cooked with more liquid and for a shorter time. Both are delicious, however stews may be served the main course for a dinner. You simply need only to add bread, salad, and a light dessert to complete the meal.

With the cold days ahead you might try one of the following recipes. Remember they have improved it for you are made ahead, allowing seasonings to marinate. Too, most stews freeze well so make a large quantity so you will have some left over. Browning the meat before adding the vegetables adds color and flavor to the stew.
