Forc. Reagan administration tax cuts, new accelerated rates of depreciation, and an increase in the initial exemption from inheritance taxes as being evidence of legislation that could produce very positive results for the retail merchant.

However, Grauch warned local merchants that much of the federal government's redistribution of power to the states, when looked at in conjunction with the recent tax cuts, could be seen as merely shifting the burden so that more responsibility will fall on the shoulders of state politicians. In many cases, Grauch said that the state will now be faced with the decision of either increasing state taxes or cutting programs that were previously funded federally.

Specific areas of discussion ranged from the Truth-in-Lending Law, Bankruptcy Law, Unemployment Insurance, to Home Rule and the impending restructuring of representational districts.
