married mothers of preschoolers and enabled for those without dependent children. This constitutes a revolution in family life in America," Clayton said.

A third major change in family life concerns the rate of people marrying for the first time. Most are 1 1/2 years older than their counterparts two decades ago.

This will mean a lifetime of singlehood for more people, Clayton said. Although about 40 percent of women between 20 and 24 had never married compared to 28 percent in 1960.

"I believe divorce will decrease even further - with deaths becoming more of a problem," Clayton said. Currently, 85 percent of all the men and 88 percent of all women who have ever married are still married to their first spouse, Clayton said.

However, 79 percent of all children under 18 live with two parents. "Children still grow up to be adults and most of them do so successfully," Clayton added.
