**PUMPKIN CAKE**  
3 cups flour  
1 1/2 tablespoons baking powder  
2 teaspoons soda  
2 teaspoons pumpkin-pie spice  
1 teaspoon salt  
4 eggs, beaten  
1 cup white sugar  
1 cup packed light brown sugar  
2 cups cooked pumpkin  
1 cup oil  
Stir together flour, baking powder, soda, pumpkin-pie spice and salt. Set aside. Beat eggs until frothy, add sugar and beat until very thick. Stir in pumpkin and oil until smooth. Thoroughly blend flour mixture into creamed mixture. Pour into greased and floured 8-inch cake pan. Bake in moderate oven for about one hour or until a tester comes out clean. Cool 10 minutes in pan before removing. Cool completely on wire rack. Drizzle with chocolate frosting or glaze.

**CHOCOLATE GLAZE**  
1 tablespoon butter  
1 square unsweetened chocolate  
Dash of salt  
1/4 teaspoon vanilla  
1/4 cups confectioner's sugar  
2 or 3 tablespoons milk  
In small saucepan over low heat melt butter and chocolate. Stir in salt and vanilla. Add sugar alternately with milk until of drizzling consistency. If frosting is desired, add more liquid. Drizzle over cake. If you do not care for the chocolate, simply omit it.
