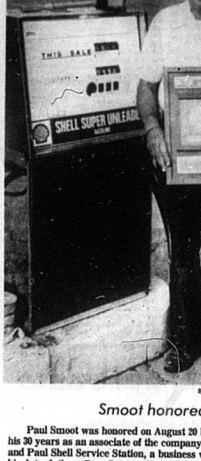

Shakertown Heritage weekends scheduled

The year-round tradition to one of the most unusual religious sects in Kentucky, the Shakers, will be celebrated this year with three special heritage weekends highlighting the culture, crafts and history of Shaker Village at Pleasant Hill. September 12-13, 19-20 and 26-27 are scheduled weekends during which craftspeople and performers, some as far as 400 miles away, will join the staff of historic Shaker Village to demonstrate the crafts, songs and history of Shaker Village. Quilting, herb cooking, herb processing, blacksmithing, spinning, candle dipping, beehive-oven baking, basketry, tool painting and shouffleting will be demonstrated each heritage weekend. Demonstrations will take place in the 27 restored buildings of the Shaker village and along its roads. A unique addition to this year's roster of crafts will be the production and spinning of silk (Pleasant Hill Shakers introduced the craft to Kentucky in the 1880s). This particular Shaker industry has never before been demonstrated by a contemporary artisan at Pleasant Hill. Silkworms in various stages (eggs, larvae, cocoons, the reeling process from cocoons and silk spinning will be demonstrated in the restored buildings. Each weekend a different professional or semi-professional choral or instrumental group will perform. Music and dance forms created by the Shakers in the 19th century for their worship services. On Sept. 12, the Louisville Ballet Company dances "The Shakers" in the restored buildings of the Musical Antebellum group perform; and Sept. 19-20, the Western Shaker Singers will perform "The Shaker Music."
