### Motorboat license fees increase

Nicholas Circuit Court Clerk Billy Watkins has been informed of an increase in boat license fees, as a result of the passage of HB 500 during the recent legislative session.

Mrs. Watkins said the new fee structure, issued by the Bureau of Vehicle Registration is as follows:

All vessels with a length of 10 feet through 20 feet, 11 inches. fee is \$14.

All vessels with a length of 20 feet through 30 feet, 11 inches. fee is \$18.

All vessels with a length of 30 feet and more. fee is \$24.

All vessels with a length of 40 feet and more. fee is \$30.

All vessels with a length of 50 feet and more. fee is \$36.

The new license fees for boats took effect Monday, April 13, 1982.
