**tablespoon dried parsley**  
1 tablespoon grated onion  
1 tablespoon oil  
1/2 teaspoon seasoned salt  
Blend together all ingredients; chill. Serve with raw vegetables such as whole cherry tomatoes, bite-size pieces of cauliflower, celery and carrot strips. Makes 4 cups. If that is more than you will need make half the amount.

**WELSH RABBIT**  
Melt 1/2 pound sharp Cheddar cheese in heavy skillet. Stir constantly over low heat 5 minutes. Add 1/2 cup milk, 1 teaspoon dry mustard, 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, 1/2 cup of hot pepper sauce. Lastly, add one egg and continue stirring over low heat until thick. Do not allow to boil. Serve over toast. Makes 4 to 6 servings.

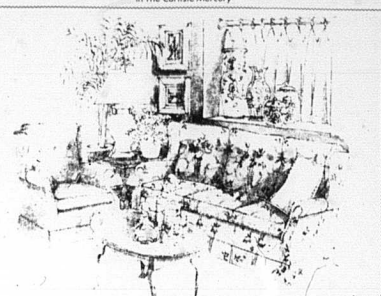
