Young people working at summer jobs in which tips comprise a substantial part of earnings should be aware of the importance of making sure all their earnings — including tips — are reported for Social Security purposes. Reporting tips can mean a significant difference in the amount of Social Security benefits they will be eligible for if they should become disabled or the public to view.

Local hospital gets check Don Mills makes appointments

State Attorney General Steven Beshear has announced that hospitals in Kentucky, including Nicholas County Hospital, will be getting checks as a result of an anti-drug case settlement involving the synthetic pesticide called amplicin.

Kentucky filed suit in 1973 along with 44 other states, alleging that parent company Bristol-Myers and two other companies fraudulently acquired the patent on amplicin and "conspired to limit the sales of the drug by refusing to sell to bulk or under any other trade name."

Total settlement was \$7,261,817, of which Nicholas County Hospital has been awarded \$699.25. Burkes County Hospital was awarded \$152.12 and Fleming County Hospital was awarded \$96.01.

71 Thoroughbreds Are Recognized
