School lunch applications

Bill Gutter, food service director for the Nicholas County Schools, announced this week that applications for free and reduced price lunch will be sent home with each student on Monday, Aug. 23. The applications have been changed to require that the Social Security numbers of all eligible parents be included. Failure to provide these Social Security numbers will result in the application being denied until the numbers are provided.

New Federal regulations Mr. Gutter also announced that the local school system is required by new federal regulations to verify the income given on the application for three percent of those applications received. These applications must be randomly chosen from all applications received. These parents whose applications are selected will be asked to meet with school officials and present evidence to verify the income shown on the application. Documents which will be accepted in verifying the income include pay check stubs, withholding forms, farm income documents, etc. Copies of all documents will be retained by local school officials to document to state and federal monitors that the required verification process has been completed.

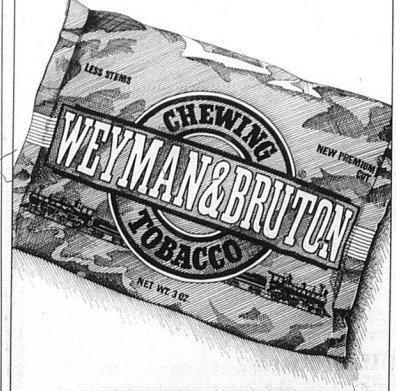
