The Veterans Administration is re-manning certain Kentucky disabled veterans of military service that they may be entitled to a grant from the VA for a home especially adapted to their needs. Lee Canfield, director of the VA regional office in Louisville, said that veterans who may be eligible for the grant of up to \$12,000 must be entitled to compensation for a permanent and total service-connected disability, due to specific conditions. The VA grant may not be more than 10 percent of the cost of building, buying or remodeling
