Keep a wary eye when shopping for kids toys!

People shopping for children's toys this holiday season should select gifts with a wary eye in order to spare a child's eyes, warns the National Society of Professional Toy Manufacturers. "It is imperative that the shopper inspect the toy in the store, and select one that is suited to the child's age. Before making a final purchase, the Society advises shoppers to look for some of the following eye hazards: Blurry edges, points, nails, screws, or pins that are exposed or can be easily exposed by the child. Projectile toys, such as guns that can shoot darts or cork, that can cause eye injuries. Rigid interior frames that can poke through outside fabric or plastic. Toys that shatter or break easily. Equally alarming are eye injuries caused when using BBs, pellets, bows and arrows and air, gas or spring operated guns. "Sometimes handled as a toy, these weapons can be especially dangerous in the wrong hands," Miss Zollinger adds.
