**Kay's Kitchen**

I'm sure everyone has Fruiteaks, Pound Cakes, Custard and Eggnog available, and cooking for dinner during the holidays. Just thought you might want to have a easy and not too rich a dessert to serve for a change. Of course fresh fruit is always refreshing after a heavy meal, and served with cheese, gives a special treat. Try combining chunks of fresh, canned and frozen fruit of your choice with their juices in a composite. Cheeses that will with fruit are Gorgonzola, Brie and Lancashire, or any other so-called "soft" cheeses.

Cheese fruits are plentiful now, so you might want to save an old-fashioned Ambrosia.

**HOLIDAY AMBROSIA**  
6 medium oranges, peeled and sliced  
1 cup pitted dates, cut in half lengthwise  
1 cup flaked coconut  
1 cup raisins  
2 tablespoons brown sugar  
2 teaspoons fresh orange peel (grate the orange before peeling and wash well)  
In glass composite or serving dish, arrange alternate layers of orange slices, dates and coconut. Combine sour cream, sugar and 2 teaspoons orange peel, chill. Serve over fruit, sprinkle with remaining orange peel.

**CHOCOLATE MOUSSE**  
2 cups whipping cream, stiffly beaten  
6 egg whites at room temperature  
1 teaspoon cream of tartar  
1/4 cup sugar  
1 teaspoon vanilla  
Add the cream of tartar to the egg whites and beat the egg whites until they are stiff. Gradually beat in the sugar a little at a time and add the vanilla. Continue to beat the egg whites stiffly for 10 minutes.  
Fold the whipped cream and egg whites together with a wide rubber spatula. Refrigerate.  
In a sauceron carefully melt, then cool 4 ounces semi-sweet chocolate  
1/4 cup dark light rum  
Fold the cooled chocolate mixture into the meringue and whipped cream mixture until blended. Place the mixture in a bowl or individual serving dishes. Decorate with additional whipped cream and grated chocolate. Refrigerate.
