Burley prices slip, quality falls too

Burley tobacco auctions resumed for the Christmas holidays after Wednesday, Dec. 15, and are scheduled to resume Monday, Jan. 10, 1983. Prices were lower for numerous grades last week but condition of marketing showed considerable improvement, reports the Federal Reserve Market News Service. The percentage of sales placed under lease increased over last week. Volume remained heavy at most markets the entire week. More sales for the three days comprising the fifth week totaled 148,397,000 pounds and averaged \$178.47 per hundred - up 40 cents from last week. The season figure reached 607,275,138 pounds averaging \$181.11. Pre-Christmas sales last week totaled \$12.9 million, down 10 percent from \$14.3 million last week. The burley cooperatives received 18.4 million pounds of tobacco (12.7 percent of sales) last week and 164 million pounds (12.9 percent) for the season.

Sherriff investigates two wrecks

Pickup trucks driven by David B. Byrd, 26, Carlisle, and Terry L. Smith, 35, of Route 4, Carlisle, side-swung each other Dec. 18 at 10:10 p.m. on the Cane Run Road, according to reports to the sheriff's office.
