Tobacco subcommittee hearing is set for Monday

Rep. Larry J. Hopkins, R-Ky., will host an official field hearing of the House Subcommittee on Tobacco and Potomac Monday, Feb. 22, at the U.S. College of Agriculture. Hopkins, a representative on the House Agriculture Committee and ranking member on the tobacco subcommittee, is holding the hearing "to give the people of Kentucky an opportunity to make recommendations on proposed changes in the tobacco program."

Gasoline prices have stabilized and even dropped in some parts of Kentucky in recent weeks, but are likely to rise again in the next few weeks, according to a spokesman for the state's business of running automotive equipment.

Conversion equipment "is more sophisticated than it used to be, and the spread of potential savings is just tremendous," said Jay Wootch, president of Columbia Gas Service in Louisville.

Equipment installed in the transition includes a pressurized fuel tank; a filter that locks up the fuel when the fuel in the tank is started; a converter to regulate the pressure and vaporize the liquid fuel and a carburetor to mix the fuel and air for proper combustion.
