 Twelve-month comparisons show considerable price stability during the past year in the three major product components of the market basket. The largest single surge group comprised 11 items of beef, pork and poultry, and down 3.8 percent since January 1981. The secondary products have registered only a slight increase since last January, totaling less than one percent, and the eight grain-based foods are down one percent during the year.
 Meathead claimed the lowest local marketbasket average for January while Jackson was highest. Volunteer surveys from Farm Bureau's women's group checked supermarket prices in 22 Kentucky communities.
