PART TWO

In 1947, Russel Strawn, our farm foreman for 44 years, and our son Arthur, aged 16, rebuilt their cabin. Built in 1792 with the help of Simon Kenton, it was the only rest house built here ever had. It located in a near a falling vein of water. We built the same rocks to rebuild the cabin at the head of it. Russ and Art and the same rocks to rebuild the chimney, had the shingles turned out with a fire, and got help from pioneer barns for the main structure. Presently the D.A.R. would reconstruct this cabin in the Blue Licks Park and Henry Ford offered me \$10,000 for it if I would sell it.

About 1860 Russ, who has built several houses and barns and 100 miles of fence, restored the Metcalf Cabin and built a stone wall around it. A family cemetery in Kentucky belongs to perpetuity to this family as long as it is maintained. My father, who was the planer to use it, as our only family grave, and he was buried there. My father's sister are already buried there.
