Stumbo resigns Confirms Gov. Brown's announcement

Dr. Grady Stumbo confirmed Governor John Y. Brown's announcement that he has submitted his resignation as Secretary of the Department for Human Resources effective Nov. 15, 1982.

Stumbo said he will spend the remaining five months concentrating on major projects such as medical care for indigent people, medical cost containment, implementation of nursing home reform, reorganization of the state's local health departments, and the contract with NHC of Louisville to operate that city's University Hospital. Responding to reporters' questions Stumbo said he has not made a decision on whether to run for public office. "I will not make a decision on my political future until I am Secretary of the Department for Human Resources," he said. "After I leave I will have to choose whether I will go back to my medical practice in Eastern Kentucky or become a candidate."

Stumbo and his friend, State Senator Berry Ray Bixby, founded the nationally recognized East Kentucky Health Services Center Feb. 1971. "That clinic was a dream of ours, an important milestone and something I am very proud of," he said. His resignation was made five

Ambulance service by air began July 1

Carlisle now has a direct link with the Louisville medical community through Kentucky's first hospital-based air ambulance service, which began operating July 1.

The Jewish Hospital SkyCare helicopter provides a safe, fast ride to transport critically ill or injured patients within a 100-mile radius of Louisville. It will transport patients from one hospital to another, or from an accident scene to a hospital.

SkyCare is a fully equipped and staffed emergency medical transport center. It carries a crew of three — flight nurse, paramedic and pilot — and one patient. SkyCare is one of more than 40 hospital-based air ambulance services in the U.S. today.

No public funds or tax dollars are used to pay for SkyCare. As with ground ambulance service, the fees for SkyCare are billed to the patients and/or their insurance carriers.

SkyCare can be requested by physicians, hospitals, state or local law enforcement agencies, ambulance and emergency medical services, industrial nurses, fire departments and other designated emergency authorities.

The service is available 24 hours a day. A toll free number has been established to request SkyCare in Kentucky: 1-800-752-6621.
