Mix ground beef lightly with salt and onion in large patty. Cook to desired doneness. Top with extra sauce slices and spoon a generous ladle of piping hot ripp ripp sauce over all. Top with slice of ripe tomato. Serve as an open-face sandwich on thick slices of French bread.

BAREBIT SAUCE
1 tablespoon margarine
1/2 cups sharp Cheddar cheese, diced
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon dry mustard
1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1 egg yolk

Melt margarine in heavy saucpan over low heat. Stir in and melt the cheese, add seasoning and slowly add milk, enough to make a thick sauce. Beat in egg yolk. Serve over the meat patty and bacon.

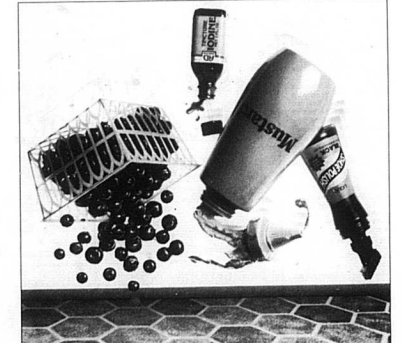
