### Block Grant funds accepted by Kentucky

Kentucky is now one of two states in the nation to formally accept federal funds under the new community development block grant program. Governor John Y. Brown Jr. formally received the grant today.

The grant, approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, will be administered by the office of community development within the state Commerce Cabinet. Under terms of the grant, any city or county in Kentucky with the population of less than 50,000 may apply for funds.

Brown said that grants from the award will be used for housing, public facilities and economic development projects that principally benefit low and moderate income people.

The funds also may be used for projects designed to eliminate slums or blighted conditions.

Applications are now being accepted for the funds and will be considered on a competitive basis.

In making the announcement, Brown explained that Kentucky and North Dakota are the only two states in the nation that have been approved for funding under the program which permits states to assume full responsibility for the distribution and administration of community development block grants.

Kentucky was included in the program after having been selected in 1981 as part of a federal demonstration project to develop block grant selection criteria.

### State moves to control starlings

Farmers in 56 counties participated in the Kentucky Department of Agriculture's starling-baiting program this winter to help curb the blackbird population in several nesting areas across the state.

Starlings are omnivores which eat Kentucky farmers thousands of dollars in cornmeal feed each year and do damage to equipment and buildings. The birds pollute drinking water and are carriers of poultry and livestock diseases, including TSE (transmissible spongiform encephalitis). In addition, their habit of roosting in large numbers causes public concern about health hazards, such as histoplasmosis.

Normally, starlings feed on insects and trash. However, in winter months, when food is in short supply, they are attracted to feedlot areas. The Agriculture Department provides starling-baiting, an effective, slow-acting poison, to farmers who have a blackbird problem and whose costs continue upward.

The farm value of birds sold through grocery stores rose by only 3.5 percent, the smallest increase since 1977. The farm value is the amount of the retail price that pays for farm-produced ingredients.
