The Robertson County Women's Club is sponsoring the annual July celebration at Mt. Olivet.

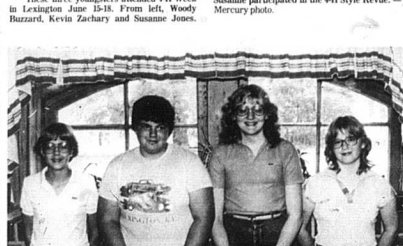

The 17th season of the Legend of Daniel Boone by Emmy award-winning playwright Jim Harrison opened Saturday, June 12.

Situated in historic Harrodsburg, the play, complete with flaming Indian attacks and dances, traces the story of the establishment of Booneboro and the American Revolution.

This season, however, has an exciting new look as an entirely new musical score has been written and recorded by composer Joseph Foster, a Rutgers University faculty member. Mr. Foster has worked on the score for the past year to give the show's director, Colton Hall, a score that will give the drama an epic quality. With new sound equipment to enhance the score, and microphones to amplify the actors' voices, this season presents a chance for theater goers to feel as if they are returning to the late 1700's and are as one with Boone's life.

The Legend of Daniel Boone will be presented Saturday, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday through August 21. On Thursday and Friday evenings at 8:30 p.m. the premiere season of *Lancaster* will be presented. Tickets for either show are \$20 for adults, \$25 for persons over 65 and \$4 for children under 12. Groups of 25 or more receive a 10 percent discount.

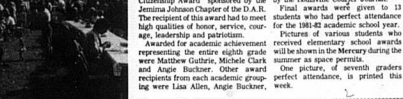
Awards Day held at elementary school
