Girl Scout Cookie Drive is underway in Carlisle

The annual Girl Scout Cookie Sale, a major fund raising effort for over 17,000 girls from Wilderness Head Girl Scout Council, is now in progress. Nicholas County Girl Scouts will be selling the delicious baked goods until March 22, according to Mrs. Sam Reynolds, Nicholas County Council Chairman.

The purpose of the Girl Scout Cookie Sale, a Girl Scout tradition since 1936, is to help raise money for local troop activities, and to help support Wilderness Head Council's outdoor program and camp development. Fifteen cents of each box sold stays in the home troop to help pay for program supplies and other troop plans. The remainder of the profits go to help support Wilderness Head Council's five campsites. This year local girls are selling six kinds of cookies: Thin Mints, Assorted Sandwiches, Peanut Butter Sandwich, Shortbread, Peanut Butter Fudge, and Caramel Delious Cookies. The cookies sell for \$1.20 a box.

BARBECUE MEAT LEAF SALAD*
1/2 pound ground chuck
1 cup fresh bread crumbs
1 onion, chopped fine
1 egg, beaten
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon pepper
1 can (8 ounce) tomato sauce

LEMON CHICKEN
1 2 1/2-pound broiler or fryer, cut into serving pieces
3 tablespoons lemon juice
1/2 teaspoon fresh minced or dried Garlic salt
Pepper
Arrange chicken in baking dish, skin side up, and bake 20 minutes in a preheated 425 degree oven. Remove dish from oven and pour off the fat that has accumulated in dish. Turn chicken and spoon lemon juice over pieces, sprinkle with garlic salt, parsley and pepper. Return chicken to oven and cook in 375 degree oven for 30 minutes. Baste with lemon juice once during cooking.
