

Legislative week in review.

As the day draws to a close, it is not certain when the 1982 session of the legislature appears, but with only 10 legislative days left at the week session budget for the next two years.

But, despite reports at mid-week that a compromise budget proposal had been agreed upon by House Democratic and Gov. John Y. Brown Jr., questions still remained about some proposed measures to raise additional revenues during the coming session.

In particular, details of a proposed amendment to tax on trucks using state highways were yet to be worked out.

Bill, the compromise — which was carried in a three-hour session of the House Democratic caucus — was another indication that final action on the budget is near.

Although none of this is "yet in concrete" — to use one of the 100 political clichés — here is a bare-bones outline of the compromise agreed to last week:

—A 15 percent tax would be imposed on liquor at the wholesale level. This would be over 500 cents, but the 10 percent tax proposed by Brown, which has been studied by legislators, would increase it to 700 cents.

—A 10 percent tax would be imposed on the retail sale of liquor. This would be an additional \$2.5 million yearly.

—The much-lauded trucking tax would be on a weight-distance formula. It would be imposed, but at a rate only half that originally proposed by Brown.

—The compromise proposal would bring in an estimated \$23 million annually.

—A package of higher fees, higher insurance rates, higher taxes on cigarettes and delinquent taxes, and certain other revenue-producing measures would be included.

next two years. Although the proposals were taken up in April, it is not certain when or in what final form they will be approved. But with only 10 legislative days left at the week session in April — and at least a couple of those days set aside for a site session in April — it is clear that the package will have to be acted upon quickly.

The General Assembly's legislative budget-environment process, which occupied center stage during the legislature's early weeks, has been completed.

The work of those budget-environment subcommittees will be taken into consideration in setting the budget, which must now be undertaken in light of the revenue-producing measures now under study.
