Kay's Kitchen

Spring, certainly was a long time coming, but now we can enjoy one of the special treats of the season, rhubarb. You can serve it simply stewed or in pies and cakes. Try some of the recipes here and I'm sure you will find one you and your family will enjoy.

- RHUBARB AND STRAWBERRY TART
Pastry for 8-inch tart
2 cups fresh rhubarb, cut into 1/2-inch slices
2 cups fresh strawberries, sliced
1/2 cup sugar
1/2 teaspoon orange rind, optional
2 tablespoons flour
2 eggs, lightly beaten
1/2 cup orange marmalade
1 tablespoon water
Preheat oven to 400 degrees. Prepare pastry and line pie tin or quiche pan with removable bottom. Cut rhubarb into one-inch pieces. Hull strawberries and cut in half if they are large. Combine fruit with sugar, orange rind, flour and egg together. Add eggs and blend thoroughly. Pour mixture into pie shell and place on baking sheet. Bake 40 minutes until set. Remove from oven and cool. Heat marmalade and water, stirring until well melted. Spoon over pie and serve.

- RHUBARB-cream CHEESE PIE
4 cups rhubarb, cut in one-inch pieces
1/2 cup sugar
2 tablespoons cornstarch
1/2 cup sugar
1 egg
1 teaspoon soda, added to 1/4 cup buttermilk
1/4 cup flour
Combine all ingredients well, then fold in 2 cups rhubarb cut in 1/2-inch pieces. Pour into baking pan and top with 1/2 cup brown sugar and 1/2 cup nuts with enough orange juice to moisten and sprinkle over top. Bake at 350 degrees 60-65 minutes. Rhubarb freezes well. Simply wash, dice and put into freezer bags. There is no need to blanch. Rhubarb sauce freezes equally well as do rhubarb pies. So while this delightful plant is in season make the most of it.
