Bridge Festival set

Planning County, Kentucky is the only county in the Commonwealth of Kentucky blessed with three covered bridges. The Covered Bridge Festival to be held on June 12 and 13 is established to advertise this fact and to help secure funds for bridge repairs and maintenance.

During the festival there will be slide presentations about these bridges and other historical landmarks at Fleming County High School. Maps marking the location of each bridge and historical data will be available during the festival.

Fleming County's fourth bridge, located in Shertown, was destroyed by fire on April 6, 1981. This was the only suspension covered bridge in the U.S.A.

Existing bridges are located at Goddard, Ringo Mill and on Kentucky 111 between Poplar Plains and Hillsboro.

Smaller apple, strawberry crops

Reports from both specialists and growers from across the state indicate this year's strawberry crop is slightly smaller than usual, said Agriculture Commissioner Allen W. Barkley II.

Barkley said the loss would be characterized as moderate. Strawberries will definitely be available, but probably at slightly inflated prices in comparison to last year. This is because growers had to make extra efforts to ensure the fruit's survival.

Irrigation doesn't always pay off, Barkley said, but this year it did, both in protecting the berries from frost and from the dry weather which has followed. He said rainmaking was also a factor in protection.

"Those who made the extra effort had a crop which survived," Barkley said.

In regard to apples, Barkley said the department's horticultural specialist Joe Howard Rogers has received reports that the crop will be smaller but of higher quality than usual.

Quality will be improved because there is less competition on the tree, Barkley said.

Consumers should be aware that the higher quality, plus the moderate loss of crop, will probably bring higher prices for that fruit also.

"At 113 a bushel, vegetables weren't harmed at all by the frost, they will likely come in several weeks later than usual because of the dry weather. But this shouldn't have any impact on price," Barkley said.

Beauty Pageant at Fleming

The Ewing Fleming County Fair Beauty Pageant plans are once again underway. The date this year has been set for Wednesday, July 7 at 7 p.m. with a Little Toddler Contest to be held the following night, Thursday, July 8.

There is no talent competition. Judging will be on figure, beauty, general appearance, poise and personality. The winner goes to Owensboro to compete statewide at the Kentucky Fair and Horse Show Convention.

Junior Miss competition will run from ages 10 to 14. They will appear in dresses. The winner will receive a complimentary trip to the State Fair in Louisville.

A Little Miss and Little Master will be selected from children ranging from ages five to nine. Both winners will compete at the State Fair.
