Kay's Kitchen

I know it would happen sooner or later, someone would want to know about TVU. I haven't written about it before because I don't have anything very good to say about it. From what I read about TVU, it is a glorified way to get people to eat the lowly soybean. The soybean is the nation's number one cash crop. Live stock feed and soybean are the most common crops in the world. Only two or three percent end up as food, and that is diagnosed as textured vegetable protein in hamburger, as soy milk, soy, or low-cholesterol meat replacement. Now it is coming to the dinner table as tofu, an ancient soybean product of the Orient, in the form of bean curd or bean cake.

Tofu is a bland, spongy and grainy in texture, could easily pass as the kitchen sponge, and is gray-white in color. Since it is so bland in flavor it easily blends right in with other food and assumes that flavor.
