Carlisle gets weatherization demonstration

The Kentucky State Weatherization Training Center Policy Management Associates Inc. (PMA) provides training and technical assistance to all of Kentucky's 25 weatherization sub-grantees who are conducting an on-site job monitoring project for the local Community Action Weatherization crew.

The project will take place from a 30 ft PMA mobile unit Oct. 21 and use the home of Bob Thompson, 1231 North Broadway, Carlisle.

Dr. John A. Stephenson, a graduate from the University of Kentucky, states that the goal of this type of monitoring project is to save the state of Kentucky thousands of dollars.

Dr. Stephenson stated that the PMA training and technical assistance project benefits the laborer in three ways.

(1) The laborer remains on the job while training; (2) The laborer never leaves the area; (3) The laborer understands the home of an approved weatherization crew.

Training and technical assistance from PMA comes on the way of the weatherization crew.

It is the first program of its type in the nation to direct and produce a weatherization video, training program and technical assistance.

PMA will provide the training and monitoring to private contractors who receive bids to weatherize homes in the community. Action Weatherization Demonstration Model Project being funded by the state. For further information call Community Action at 225-6888.
