### State Police Will not tolerate Halloween pranks

It is unfortunate but vandalism has become a much part of Halloween as ghosts and goblins. Each year destruction of property and other "dirty tricks" are reported throughout the commonwealth.

In 1981 at least three incidents on Halloween night west of Perry County died after being shot in the chest. The gunfire apparently came from a passing car. In Cumberland County a woman was hit by a truck as she was riding in the back of a truck.

On Halloween night in Johnson County last year, a teenager was permanently injured after being shot in the head by a man apparently angered by a roadblock put in place by trick-or-treaters.

What is it about Halloween that seems to bring out the worst in some people? Maybe the anonymity of wearing masks and being out after dark fosters a feeling that "anything goes" on Halloween.

Whatever the reason, the tradition of Halloween vandalism and violence will not be tolerated by the Kentucky State Police. Troopers will be on duty to protect the public and serve as a reminder that the law is still the law, even on Halloween.

Extra troopers will be patrolling in every county on Halloween. Special details will be assigned to areas identified as potential trouble spots. The state police are advising motorists to watch for rocks or other objects which may be thrown across the highway or dropped from an overpass. Motorists should also watch for obstructions placed in the road.

In addition to guarding their own safety, drivers should look out for young trick-or-treaters who may not be looking out for themselves.

Ideally, children should be collecting treats only during the time set by local authorities for the observance of Halloween. This year Halloween comes on Sunday, Oct. 31, but the official observance will vary in different locations.

The state police are also asking for parents' cooperation in making a safe Halloween this year.

Parents of trick-or-treaters should not allow their children out after dark when visibility is low. As an additional precaution, children should be in Halloween costumes which allow them to see and be seen by drivers.

Trick-or-treaters can see better if they wear Halloween makeup rather than a mask. If a mask is worn, it should have large eye openings. The mask should fit well so it won't slip.

The costume itself should be bright or white. Reflective tape can increase visibility. (The costume should also fit well. A costume which drags the ground could trip the child and cause him to fall.)

Children out at dusk should carry a flashlight, perhaps in a jack-o-lantern. They should never carry candles.

The state police advise parents to accompany their children on their Halloween rounds. If that isn't possible, the children should be accompanied by a responsible adult or teenager.

It is safest for children to collect treats only in their own neighborhood along a route determined by their parents.

In any case, children should be told not to eat any of their Halloween treats before bringing the treats home for examination by their parents. Parents
