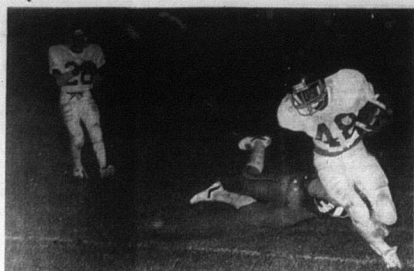


## Little league annual picnic

## Landfill may be okayed

A state inspector from the environmental protection division of the Department for Natural Resources inspected the Nicholas County landfill last week and told Judge Executive Jesse Simon he would recommend it stay open for another year. The future of the landfill has been in doubt since state inspectors told the Judge Executive earlier in the year that the landfill might not pass new, more stringent, state laws and that county might have to seek an alternate method of disposing of waste material. "We still don't know if this extension

will be approved," Judge Simon told the Mercury. "Remember that the inspector' notes still have to be approved and we have no word on that at the present time."

Methods that have been looked into by the local road in the meantime include contracting with an out-of-county private contractor to build a new landfill on a dumping site in another county. A similar system has been suggested by South County, after their landfill was shut down by the state because it was already leaking pollution into a nearby stream.
