### Bluegrass Area Cultural Arts Camp held at Carnico

The Bluegrass Area Cultural Arts Camp was held at the North Central 4-H Camp near Lake Carnico last week, with 38 ladies from Carlisle attending. The club is traditionally for homemakers club members from nine counties in the Bluegrass district. Ten major crafts were studied, including candlemaking, which was taught by the Nicholas homemakers. Candlemaking was first used in Colonial America to decorate beds, decorative bookends, masculine candy canes were sketched into unadorned masculine and then embroidered with soft, lightly treated cream-colored yarn in candle-making during the 18th century.
