### Schools offer enrichment program

Students in grades 7-11 who have demonstrated academic aptitude and excellence will participate in an Academic Enrichment Program during the 1982-83 school year. This program will consist of seminars and field trip experiences.

Students will be selected for participation in this program on the basis of their performance on the Spring 1982 testing program and their yearly grades for the 1981-82 school year. Parents of students eligible to participate will be notified by letter and their permission for the son or daughter to participate in the program obtained.

Parents who give this permission will be required to provide transportation to and from school on the days during which activities are planned. This should be no more than 11 days per school year, eight of which will be seminar activities and will require that the parent arrange transportation home only. The parent must also agree to provide the student money for meals during field trip activities.
