

### Fall planting time is here

Fall is the appropriate time for planting trees and shrubs, and for seeding and replanting lawns. The advantage of the fall planting season is that the soil is warm and moist. Another fall cool, invigorating air, which helps make planting shrubs more pleasant. In addition, fresh young trees, shrubs and lawn materials are plentifully supplied to nurseries and garden centers.

A word of advice about planting new trees: always inquire about their approximate size at maturity. Tall-growing, level-spreading trees should not be planted too close to the house, or too small a spot. Once you've selected the right tree for the right location, follow this old gardening adage: "Don't dig a 100 hole for a 20 tree." In other words, dig a hole that is twice the diameter of the tree's root ball, and half again as deep.

Trees with slender trunks, three inches or less, should be staked for support during the first two years of growth. Keep the roots well watered and the tree will have a long, healthy life.

Many homes need shrubbery to conceal foundation walls. A common mistake is to plant fast-growing shrubs that block window views and need frequent pruning. The shrubbery should be selected compact evergreens and contain those with long, trailing, fern-like growth for additional color.

A number of flowering shrubs offer a bonus in the form of brilliant fall foliage. The leaves of the euonymus, octofoil and viburnum, in name of fall, the flaming glory of the New England sugar maple.

Does your lawn look patchy? Then it's time to reseed. But don't reseed your lawn just because the grass seed is considered the top of the law, the standard that all lawn care programs must attain. It creates a soft, tender, resilient, rich green - not blue - carpet.

In recent years, improved varieties of perennial ryegrass have made it a desirable lawn component. It mixes well with bluegrass, and it grows fast.

Soil tests are rocky, poor draining or otherwise hostile to growing grass lawns. If that's been your experience, groundhogging, aeration, and top dressers are excellent soil-improvement ground covers. Consult your nursery or garden center for those that grow best in your area.
