D.O.T. implements cost-saving

Since 1980, the state Transportation Cabinet's equipment division has reduced the number of trucks in the repair and construction of Kentucky's highways.

"We have been working to put more dollars on the road," says Transportation Cabinet Director Tom McMillan. "We've approved standard business practices to our equipment division to bring that down."

"This will be the first year the cabinet has not had 12 traditional twice-a-year equipment auctions. That is because we're rebuilding everything we can and using the rest for parts," McMillan continues.

"The cabinet used to sell equipment that the buyer would drive off the lot. That doesn't make sense in today's economy."

Numerous changes have been made in the management of the state's 15,000 pieces of equipment since 1980.

Hussell Ingram, a mechanical engineer and currently acting director was assigned to the division. The first engineer assigned to equipment, he has been reworking specifications to increase competition when the state buys new equipment.

"I've completed recent systems being installed which will keep track of the equipment and more regular maintenance," he says.

"The division has purchased 100 diesel dump trucks which get twice the fuel mileage of gasoline trucks and save a lot of money in operating costs."

"The state has ended a longstanding policy of purchasing new cars and vans and purchases them as needed. Money allotted for cars now drives interest and need and the division is not burdened with obsolete trucks."

"Personal cars have been reduced to 30 percent, without a decrease in personnel."

Bankers go to school

Eastern Kentucky bankers are going to school again this fall. Coordinated by Morehead State University, the Kentucky Mountain Study group, is composed of banks participating in the American Institute of Banking (AIB) training program.

"The purpose of the AIB training is to increase an awareness of the responsibility that the financial community has in economic development and give it the knowledge to be able to fulfill that responsibility," says Dr. Bernard D. Smith, head of MSU's Department of Economics and Economics.

Female cattle must be vaccinated

So many states are putting restrictions on feeder cattle imports that the situation is rapidly changing from a major problem to an emergency, according to Agriculture Commissioner Allen W. Barkley Jr.

Barkley said that Oklahoma was only the most recent of many states sending the following notice: "Effective July 1, 1982, all female cattle which are four months of age or over must be officially vaccinated, banded (which means they must be slaughtered) or approved before they can enter the state."

"The states with restrictions include Nebraska, Louisiana, Michigan, South Dakota — that means that all 1,000 cattle we are shipping feeder calves to Barkley said."
