Watch your livestock water supply
When considering materials needed for livestock, dirt overlook water, remains a livestock Extension service. The best alternative, says Gill, is to provide an excess of clean, pure water at all times. "Realistically, we know this is not always possible," he said, citing drought conditions, shipping losses and contaminated water as reasons. Lower in cattle weight during shipping, calving periods, are losses in gilt and sows. Water, Gill said, is a must in a moving truck, can result in a 2-4 percent weight loss while 24 hours of transporting can cause an 8-10 percent weight loss.

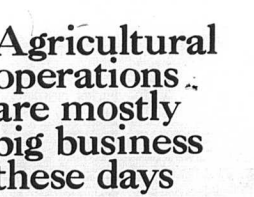
