1 tablespoon chick every season of the year is the busiest time. However, spring seems to top them all for me. There is much to be done both inside and out. Since I enjoy working in the yard, the inside is more than likely to be neglected. Wherever you are working, it is hard to stop and prepare a meal.

Here are some recipes for recipes, etc., you can fix ahead of time, either the night before or in the morning before you start those extra chores. It will make it easier when you write down what you plan to serve.

BEEF VEGETABLE BAKE
This is a meal in itself. Just serve a crusty bread and salad.

1 1/2 pounds ground beef
1 slightly beaten egg
1 cup soft bread crumbs
1 cup milk
2 tablespoons dry onion soup mix
Dash of pepper
2 tablespoons vegetable oil
1 pound can tomatoes
1/4 cup water
1/2 cup tomato catsup
1 beef bouillon cube
1/4 cup carrots, quartered and cut in half
1 medium onion, quartered
1 cup bean-sized celery chunks
Thoroughly combine in a large bowl. Add milk and onion. Drain and pat dry. Add catsup, tomato catsup, and beef bouillon cube. Stir in flour and pepper. Add milk and bring to boil, stirring constantly. Reduce heat and add cheese and mayonnaise. Cook until bubbling. Combine potatoes and ham with sauce. Pour into 13x9x2-inch baking dish. Bake at one or two later at 300 degrees and until bubbly.
