Mathers completes coroner's course
Taylor Mathers, coroner of Nicholas County, has successfully completed the Coroner's Basic Training conducted at Louisville during the week of April 18-22, 1983.
The training course was conducted by the Department of Training for coroners and deputy coroners who are to be certified by the Kentucky Justice Cabinet in meeting state standards for death scene investigations. Coroners and deputy coroners who wish to be certified as meeting the state standards must successfully complete a 36-hour basic training course and each year thereafter complete an 18-hour in-service training course.
Coroners and deputy coroners are taught subjects containing topics such as death scene investigation, forensic pathology, forensic anthropology, legal issues and other subjects applying to the tasks performed by the office of the Kentucky coroner. Upon completion of the course, a comprehensive final exam is given to each member of the class.

Cartmell Lester named county Atkins chairman

W-D-T-LL CORN: TAKE CARE OF WEEDS BEFORE PLANTING
Farmers using the no-till method of planting corn know that once the crop is planted, alternatives for eradicating weed problems are limited.
"The time for taking care of weed problems is before planting," reminds Dr. Jim Martin, weed control Extension specialist with the University of Kentucky College of Agriculture.
Martin, who is located at UK's Research and Education Center near Princeton, notes "You can't go back in with a cultivator, as in the conventional system of planting. You have to use a pre-emergence herbicide."
The first step to take before planting a field is to call over to determine the type of weeds in the field, suggests Martin. "If johnsongrass is a problem, we suggest you not plant in that field," he said, adding that johnsongrass is Kentucky's number one weed problem.
Once the weeds have been identified, proper herbicides must be selected and applied. A chemical weed control guide for farm crops in Kentucky is available at county Extension offices throughout the state.
Application of the proper herbicides is extremely important, notes the specialist. "Mistakes with application stick out like a sore thumb with no-till."
