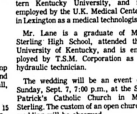

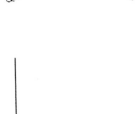

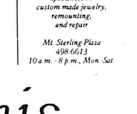

What to do with the mutton seems to be the most asked question these days. Well, I've had some help this last week. Mrs. W.G. Irwin called and gave me a recipe for Zucchini Soup, saying it was good. I tried it and it is delicious hot or cold. Here it is.

ZUCCHINI SOUP

2 medium zucchini, sliced 1 stick butter 2 chicken bouillon cubes 1 large onion, minced 1/2 teaspoon water to cover Combine all ingredients and cook tender. Pour into blender and puree until smooth. Taste for seasoning. Serve hot or cold. Here it is.
