12 floats vie for parade prizes

This year's Christmas Parade Saturday night may prove to be the biggest in the history of the event. But it is if the number of floats, an even dozen, determines the size of a parade — and 12 should put it in that category.

Mrs. Sharon Wilson, chairman of the float committee for the Carlisle-Nicholas County Chamber of Commerce-sponsored parade, reports the following organizations are entering floats: Carlisle Community Woman's Club, Civil Service, Lions Club, All Pines Club, 441 Horse Club, Nicholas County High School, PFA, 4141 Nicholas County Hospital, First Baptist Church Youth, Blue Links Church Youth, High and Game Club and Head Start/Day Care.

As of press time, there will be two bands performing in the parade: Nicholas County High School and Bourbon County High School.

Starting time for the parade is 7 p.m. with floats being asked to line up at 8 p.m. in the Nicholas County School parking lot.

Floats will move east on Main Street past the judging stand and around the courthouse square.

\$200 in prize money

There is this year's parade is "Christmas in Kentucky." A total of \$200 in prize money will be distributed. The winning float will receive \$100, with \$25 to the runner-up, \$50 for third and \$25 for fourth.

Open House at Depot

Prior to the parade, the Nicholas County Historical Society is holding a "Christmas at the Depot" open house at the renovated L&N train station.

Free hot chocolate and coffee will be served, beginning at 5:30 p.m.

The Nicholas County Hospital auxiliary will have crafts and baked goods for sale at the depot, beginning at 9 a.m. and continuing during the open house.

USDA wants public input on burley tobacco quota

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is seeking public comment on the 1984 burley tobacco quota and will hold a meeting Dec. 18 in Lexington to help gather comments, according to Everett Rank, administrator of USDA's Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service.

The meeting will be held at the University of Kentucky's E.S. Good Barn from 10 a.m. until noon and will provide a forum to discuss the outlook for burley tobacco supply and demand and other factors relating to the size of the national marketing quota for 1984. The 1983 marketing quota is 646 million pounds. Under current legislation, USDA has the authority to reduce the quota 10 percent to adjust production to maintain adequate supplies for domestic use and exports.

According to Rank, current law requires USDA to announce the national poundage quota for burley tobacco for the 1984 marketing year no later than Feb. 1. The 1984 marketing year begins Oct. 1, 1984.

Rank said the deadline for receiving written comments on the 1984 program is Dec. 23. Comments should be sent to the Director, Analysis Division, USDA-ASCS, P.O. Box 2415, Washington, D.C. 20513. He said these comments will be available for public inspection in Room 3741 of USDA's South Building.

Further details on the 1984 burley tobacco program appear in the Nov. 17 Federal Register.
