Kay's Kitchen

- The cookies this week are all easy to make, and the fondant requires no cooking and will make several different kinds of candy.
- FONDANT BROWNIES**
1/2 stick butter
1/2 cup light corn syrup
Dash salt
1/4 cup sifted confectioners sugar
Cream butter until soft in a medium-size bowl; add the corn syrup and salt; mix until completely blended. Then sugar until completely blended. Add a few minutes, or until smooth. Divide mixture into four bowls; flavor, shape and decorate as desired.
- CHOCOLATE CREAMS**
Add 1 tablespoon dry cocoa powder and 1/4 teaspoon vanilla to fondant in one bowl; knead in until completely blended. Divide into 24 even pieces; flatten each to a 1/4-inch thin round, or any shape you want. Chill until firm.
- SNOWBERRIES**
Add 1/4 teaspoon almond extract to fondant in one bowl; knead in until blended. Divide and shape in desired colors.
- COGNAC CLUSTERS**
1/4 cup finely packed brown sugar
1/4 cup granulated sugar
1/4 teaspoon cinnamon
1/4 cup water
2 tablespoons butter or margarine
1/4 teaspoon vanilla
1 1/2-cup hot flaked coconut
Combine brown and granulated sugars, cinnamon and water in medium-size heavy saucepan. Heat slowly, stirring constantly until sugar dissolves, then cook rapidly, without stirring, to 238 degrees in a candy thermometer. (A thermometer of wood will form a soft ball when dropped in cold water.) Remove from heat at once.
Stir in butter or margarine. Cool mixture in pan on a wire rack to 200 degrees. Stir in vanilla and coconut. Then beat several minutes, or until mixture holds its shape but is still glossy. Drop by teaspoons, one inch apart, on wax paper. Let stand until firm.

1 cup sugar
1/2 cup light corn syrup
1 tablespoon butter or margarine
1 teaspoon salt

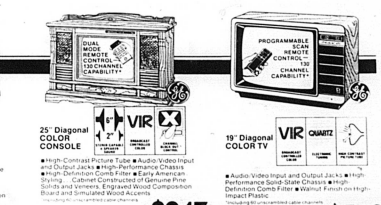
