



'Roll out the barrel(s)'

U.S. 68 near Forest Retreat farm was the scene of a one-vehicle accident December 12 when a wheelbarrow tractor trailer left the road and overturned with its load of tobacco by-products. The driver, William Rhoads of Housatonic, Ky., was taken to Nicholas County Hospital with back injuries, according to State

Trooper Jim Curry, who investigated the accident. The load of tobacco stems, removed from a Mayville warehouse to Stockton, skidded on a curve, causing Rhoads to lose control. Workmen from Universal Leaf Co. spent three days transferring the barrels to another truck.
