Pre-registered freshmen will register from 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. on Tuesday, Jan. 10, and all students that have not registered will enroll from 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Wednesday, Jan. 11. Classes will begin at 8 a.m. on Thursday, Jan. 12. The last day to register for a full class load is Monday, Jan. 16, and the last day to register for credit is Monday, Jan. 23.
