weight and grade of each lot delivered. Also, the grower will be mailed a later date a Grower Agreement, to sign and return to the Association. The tobacco will be received and processed in the usual manner, and offered for sale as soon as possible after Oct. 1, 1983.
That tobacco which does not sell for a satisfactory price will be tendered for loan under the 1983 program.
Proceeds from sales or loans advanced, less expenses (storage, insurance, grading, and the assessment fee for the No Net Cost Fund, etc.), during the carryover period, will be distributed to participating growers after Oct. 1, 1983.
There will be no other charges to the growers.

False alarms plague county

County farmers responded to two false fire alarms on Saturday, Feb. 5, but also responded to a truck fire on U.S. 48, according to Fire Chief Woody Wilson.
At just before 8 a.m. on that date, farmers were called to a location four miles west of Carlisle on U.S. 48, where a Southern States truck locked up its trailer brakes. The brakes caught fire and the subsequent heat caught at least two tires on fire and damaged them. No one was injured.
The two false alarms came in on Saturday at around noon. One was to the James Mann residence on Upper Jackdonors Road and the second to trailer #2 at the Seaton Trailer Court, two miles west of Carlisle.

Some burley markets close; prices hold

The market for burley tobacco held steady during the sixth week of auctions, reports the Federalist Market News Service. Grade averages were mostly unchanged from last week as was quality of marketing. Volume was light with several markets closing under loan increased considerably. Gross sales this week totaled \$2,300,867 per hundred—down only 58 cents from the previous week. The season figure reached \$4,184,960 pounds averaging \$180.82. During 22 sales days last season \$76,962,174 pounds averaged \$180.87. Resales amounted to 1,983,393 pounds this week and 73,250,390 pounds for the season. By the latest crop estimate, 86 percent of this year's crop has been sold. Averages remained the same for about two-thirds of the grades compared with levels of the previous sale while others recorded only small variations. With the exception of mixed

grades, which are selling \$10 to \$20 above support, most marketings are averaging the same as their support price.
This week's marketings by group were: flyings about five percent of sales, colors 20 to 40, type 1, mixed 7, nondescript 2 and upgrade about 4 percent.
Loan receipts amounted to 38.6 percent of sales this week and 38.9 percent for the season. Last season loan was 38.1 percent was placed under loan.
